

## WEST BLOOMFIELD TOWN BOARD

### Workshop Meeting

April 22, 2009

Present: Supervisor Champlin, Councilmen Hagen, Ferguson  
Also Present: Town Clerk Mary Grundman, Highway Superintendent Jim Powers, Code Enforcement Officer Scott Storke, Karl Hritz, Timothy Murphy  
Absent: Councilmen Rehberg and Miller

Supervisor Champlin opened the meeting at 7:00.

#### Bloomfield Library

Supervisor Champlin advised the Board that the East Bloomfield Town Board proposed legislation to the state to create a library district to fund the Bloomfield Library. The legislation was not passed because the Town of West Bloomfield was not aware of the request and has not submitted a resolution in favor of the formation. Supervisor Champlin advised the Board that such a district would cost the West Bloomfield tax payers approximately fifty cents per thousand on their Town County Tax bills and he wants to make the residents aware of the proposal made by East Bloomfield. Mr. Murphy spoke to Supervisor Champlin before the meeting and said he would return at some other time to speak to the Board about the issue.

#### Factors Walk

The Code Enforcement Officer gave the Board an update on the Factors Walk road construction. Phase II has started and the dedication of Phase I is complete and ready for Supervisor Champlin to sign.

#### RESOLUTION #50

##### SG Security

Superintendent Powers advised the Board that the NYS Health Department requested an intrusion alarm at the pump station and he has a quote from SG Security for \$443.00 for the installation. Councilman Hagen made the motion to approve the installation, seconded by Councilman Ferguson.

Adopted: Ayes – Champlin, Hagen, Ferguson Nays- None

Resolves that Superintendent Powers is authorized to purchase the intrusion alarm for the pump house.

#### Stone Storage at Town Hall

Superintendent Powers asked the Board if they were in favor of the Highway Department storing stone at the Town Hall. The Board agreed.

#### Town Hall

Supervisor Champlin advised the Board that he, Superintendent Powers and the Code Enforcement Officer met with Paul Chatfield to discuss the Town Hall planning. They discussed possible location, funding, contracting and the modular construction such as the Town Hall in Prattsburg discussed at the April 8<sup>th</sup> meeting. Paul advised them that the next step is to do a needs assessment and drawing which Supervisor Champlin would like to move ahead with.

At 7:50 Councilman Hagen made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Ferguson.
